



EETC Technician Certification

HOW TO RECERTIFY

In order to make it easy for you to recertify there are now two ways you can maintain your EETC Technician Certification status.

1. You can retake the certification test in your specific area(s).
2. You can submit documentation of continuing education in your specific area(s).

1. TAKING THE TEST

If you prefer to take the test again you will need to complete the standard “EETC Technician Certification Registration Form”. Be sure to check the box marked “Recertifying by taking test”. Before completing the application you will need to contact your nearest Test Administrator to schedule a test time and date. You can locate your closest test administrator by visiting the EETC web site at www.eetc.org for a list of test proctors that serve your area. You can also contact the EETC at (262) 567-1185 for a test proctor. When completing the application be sure to include the test location information and payment. If you pass the test, you will be recertified for an additional three years and receive a new certificate.

2. USING CONTINUING EDUCATION TO RECERTIFY

In order to simplify the recertification of technicians, the EETC has designed a new option that will allow technicians to use their continuing education and manufacturer service schools as credit towards recertification. This program will allow technicians to submit copies of training certificates and original certification letter in lieu of taking the EETC Technician Certification tests again. If you qualify, you will be recertified for an additional three years. **Note: If you are are a power equipment distributor representative you will not need to include certificates with your application.**

Listed below are the criteria needed to recertify. You must meet the minimum criteria for each specific area. For example, if you are certified in two-cycle, you must maintain a master technician status from any two-cycle manufacturer or attend three two-cycle manufacturer/distributor update seminars. Attending one semester at a technical school or one one-week manufacturer school in two-cycle engines also qualifies you.

Because electrical systems are part of many manufacturers’ products, to qualify for Electrical Recertification you must attend a minimum of three, various manufacturer/distributor update seminars. This can include two-cycle or four-cycle manufacturers or one semester at a technical school or one one-week manufacturer school.

To qualify in hydraulics you must maintain master technician status from a hydraulics manufacturer or attend three update seminars from a manufacturer/distributor that uses hydraulic drive systems on their products, or attend one semester at a technical school or one one-week manufacturer school that has training in hydraulics.

EETC Technician Certification HOW TO RECERTIFY

In order to recertify without taking a certification test, you will need to:

1. Submit a copy of your manufacturer master technician certificate in your area of recertification.

-OR-

2. Submit copies of three manufacturer/distributor update seminar certificates. Example 1: three, two-stroke update seminars from any two-stroke manufacturers to qualify for your two-stroke recertification. Example 2: three, four-stroke update seminars from any four-stroke engine manufacturers to qualify for your four-stroke recertification.

-OR-

3. Submit a copy of a certificate received from attending one semester at a technical school or a one-week manufacturer school with training in your area of certification.

-AND-

4. Submit a copy of the Application For Recertification and payment. Your payment goes toward maintaining your records in our data base and sending out your new three year certificate.

Please complete the attached Application For Recertification form. Submit your completed form and appropriate certificates along with your payment of \$47.00 (\$37 for students). Make checks payable to EETC. (NOTE: Be sure to make copies of your recertification application for your records.) **Send all of this information to the address on the application.**

Note: To ensure your privacy and security we have changed both the test registration form and the recertification form. We no longer require your social security number for tracking. We have replaced that with your birth date so that we can connect you with past tests that you have taken.
